EARLY LEARNING CENTER (ELC) IS NOW ROGUE PRIMARY SCHOOL (RPS)

- Mascot will be the "Playful Otters" to celebrate "learning by doing" teaching pedagogy
- Constructed for 330 students, can be expanded to 550 students

BOND PROJECT STATUS

- Complete
 - o Hazardous Material Abatement at Rogue Primary School
 - Move Management from 4ES and HMS
- Under Construction
 - o Rogue Primary School
 - Jewett New Building gained time to completion to early November
 - o Jewett ES MEP Upgrades and SIA project (New Bathrooms and La Clinica Remodel)
 - o Mae Richardson ES MEP Upgrades
 - o Sams Valley ES MEP Upgrades
 - Patrick ES MEP Upgrades
 - o CPSD District-wide Selective Door & Frame Replacement
- In Design
 - Hanby Middle School: new elevator, restrooms and five additional classrooms!
 - o Scenic MS: campus-wide scoping occurring
 - o Crater HS: campus-wide scoping occurring
- Headwinds
 - o Costs remain volatile
 - Supply chain remains challenging
 - o MRE fencing code change forthcoming
 - o New principals bring new ideas

CPSD BOND PROGRAM DASHBOARD

- Review of Bond Goals
- Achieved 55% of the required 85% encumbered goal
- Current Bond Program: \$106,624,803
 - o New ESSER funds \$5,000,000
- Bond Program bottom line: -\$2,082,884 (less than 2% in the red)

Q&A, DISCUSSION

- How are RPS neighbors reacting to the development?
 - o Mostly positive at last month's open house
- When will RPS be accepting students?
 - o Fall 2022
- Elementary school crowding
 - o Rogue Primary School will relieve pressure from K-1 initially at CPE, JES and MRE
- HVAC projects are more complicated than they appear
 - o Involves hazardous material abatement, new power, ductwork, structural work
- Supply chain presents challenges
 - o Construction team is going a great job staying on schedule given trying times
- Does District receive SB1149 monies?
 - o To leverage bond dollars District uses SB1149 monies on non-bond projects: CPE boilers, District-wide lighting upgrades, future HMS, SMS and CHS MEP projects
- Will District receive additional SIA funds?
 - District anticipates receiving additional funds going forward for capital improvements for (mainly) restrooms and locker rooms
- Air quality will be much improved in the schools
 - o Electrostatic filters, HEP filters in all learning spaces, night flushing
